Rationale Context & background

Every life is full of challenges. These challenges test our ability to resolve the difficulties that come our way and help us to emerge as winners. In this process the only thing that truly matters is for who we choose to act and react. Life is all about learning, adopting, and converting all the struggles that we experience, to something positive. This is the life of Ms. Anjina Rajagopal, not born with any silver-spoon but brought up with her seven siblings by her humble parents. During her teenage years, she lost her mother disrupting her education and later, her father's ill health disturbed the economy of the family. She managed to get a job in a private firm and after some years she joined The Times of India.



In 1987 her father passed away and in 1988 she started the journey for setting up Saikripa. She, being a devotee of Shirdi Sai Baba, named the society SAIKRIPA. Being a woman, she faced lots of criticism and discouragements from her family, friends and colleagues for taking this step but with cooperation of like-minded associates she founded the society. After one year the Society got registered on 8th March 1989. Though people showed their appreciation, nobody did anything to help the society progress. Frustration was getting to take hold of her. It was on one such day while going to the office in 1990, she came across a physically handicapped orphan boy of about 10 years being beaten by a street vendor in front of Pyare Lal Bhavan, ITO, New Delhi for demanding some eatables. Taking pity on this boy she took him into her home. When in pain, or just for a touch of comfort who is it that we reach for? A MOTHER. Anjina became a mother from then on.

One has to be grateful for the roots given by her to Saikripa that grew wings to fly high. Her vision and nurturing that built the charity Saikripa operates at a scale and a foundation that serves hundreds today.



Saikripa was started with the aim to stand up in the society for the needy children to uphold their feelings of love, independence, self-respect, and dignity, irrespective of colour, caste, and creed. It began with the main objective to create a positive loving environment in which the orphaned, abandoned and neglected children feel at home. A significant effort is invested in re-socializing the children after they come into the home that is named BAL KUTIR.

The quality of what children experience in their childhood is a key determinant of how they learn, develop and live. They are trained to develop a strong desire in them to seek knowledge to understand the world and to find meaning and purpose in LIFE.



While children have been spared of COVID infection, the pandemic induced lockdown changed their life in multiple ways with restrictions and Regulations being followed resulting in more screen time, lesser physical activity and higher irritability, reduced attention span that has impacted the physical, emotional, and social growth.

Nature is a child’s first window into wonder. It enriches children for life. All children should grow up with space to imagine nature’s magic. There are endless wonders hidden in nature. Nature’s mysteriousness is one of its main qualities. It is as if nature is a place that you can step in to discover all sorts of new, interesting things. For this purpose, the children of Bal Kutir were taken to the Okhla Bird Sanctuary, into the rich diversities of flora and fauna.

This enabled nature-based learning for children.





Achievements of Bal Kutir-

Kajal: She was brought to Saikripa in the year 2004 at the age of around 8 years. She is now 25 yrs. She is physically underdeveloped with a height of just around 3 feet and 6 inches. Her IQ is 20 but she was given treatment and has shown improvement. She was unable to do any activity on her own and needed help even for basic actions like dressing herself, brushing the teeth etc. After intense training for many years together, now Kajal has become nearly normal. Her talents include tailoring for which she has got training under Sai Vocational Training Center (SVTC). She is now able to stitch ladies' suit, frocks, skirts and many more.

Suman: She is currently pursuing Class X. She was brought to Bal Kutir in the year 2012 at the age of 6 yrs. Now she is studying in 10th Standard. She has been an active girl all through. Her interests are in dance, vocal music, oration. She is good in basic computer skills. Biology is her favorite subject and so has taken up Biology as a subject in 10th std. She is ambitious of becoming an Allopathic Doctor and serve the rural population.



Tanmay: He was brought to Saikripa when he was around four years old. Since, he did not have any exposure to education in his early childhood, it was difficult for him to cope up with the mainstream education. In his best interest Saikripa helped him to seek education through open schooling. He was assisted with experienced teachers who gave him coaching. Simultaneously he was provided with counselling that also helped him come out of his dilemmas and anxieties. Regular Counselling showed gradual improvement in his academic results, and he was able to concentrate in the studies to a great extent which made him clear his Class X examination from NIOS. Seeing his enthusiasm and determination, he was assisted further in the education that enabled him to complete his Class XII also from NOIS Board. Currently he is pursuing a certificate course in Computer Applications. He is enthusiastic and boisterous in nature and has a questioning mind to know/learn things. Despite all odds, with undeterred focus he kept moving forward. Today he is an average boy filled with enthusiasm. As regards language understanding, he is in the process of brushing up his hold on English language. If given a chance, he is determined to perform to the best with his abilities and prove worthy of the opportunity given.



After- Care Homes

Radhika: was brought to Saikripa when she was just a day-old baby and was raised at Balkutir, Saikripa. She completed her education up to secondary level at Sai Shiksha Sansthan and higher secondary level at Nehru International Public school, NOIDA. After that she got an opportunity to pursue her graduation from Amity University, NOIDA with scholarship received from one donor and passed out successfully in the course B. Tech (Food Technology). She has excelled in her academic career throughout, with having secured 10 CGPA in Class X and 85.6% in XII both from CBSE Board and has secured 8.51 CGPA up to and including seventh Semester in B.Tech. and has been dreaming of doing her Masters abroad.



Mahaveer: was brought to Bal Kutir on 11.07.2010 as a boy of five years old. He had his initial education at Sai Bal Sansar and further at Sai Shiksha Sansthan till the secondary level. Since his IQ level is subnormal, he was



not interested in pursuing studies but is very much interested in the vocation of bakery/culinary and underwent training in the bakery section of Sai Vocational Training Centre and started making various food items including cakes/pastries/cupcakes without others help. Now he is on his own and he is earning through his own food outlet where he sells all kind of snacks with tea.

Marriage of the grown-up girl



One of our grown-up girls, Babita 26 yrs. who was working as a Beautician has found her soulmate and got married in the month of January, 2022. Due to COVID



situation, the wedding ceremonies were very simple. The couple are living happily after their marriage. Saikripa is thankful to our donors and well-wishers who have given their blessings and support.



Saikripa wants to thank the caregivers and domestic workers of Saikripa who work 24x7 for the well-being of the children living at Bal Kutir. Their efforts are tremendous and selfless. Most of the staff have devoted more than two decades of their lives in the



welfare of these children.



SAI SHIKSHA SANSTHAN

(April 01, 1991, to March 31, 2020)

The school Sai Shiksha Sansthan was set up in a rented premises with a tuition fee of Rs. 35/- per month in the year 1991 with primary section upgraded to the secondary level over the years and went on with a subsidized tuition fee of Rs. 500/- till March 2020.

Saikripa is now looking forward to acquiring a land to construct the school building to continue serving the needy children.

An Appeal

Vigorous efforts are on for the lookout for a land. For this, huge fund is required for acquiring an area of at-least 1,000 sq. mtr. which is costing these days around Rs. 80 lacs (INR 8 million). There are Corporates who are ready to construct building for school if Saikripa has the ownership of the land. Garnering funds to the tune of this amount is a humongous task for us, which cannot be accomplished without your support and cooperation.



SAI BAL SANSAR & SAI VATSALYA VATIKA



A free informal educational centre has been set up from KG to 5th with a separate unit for special children.

Education is the first step for the children to gain knowledge, critical thinking, empowerment, and skills that are needed to make this world a better place. This propels the children forward and equips them to face the challenges that may come their way.

Sai Bal Sansar is a free informal education center started on 23 November 1999 to train the “out of school children” viz. street/slum children and the children of unorganized labour force to teach foundational numeracy, literacy before admitting them to age-appropriate classes in the regular schools.

Fostering skills and promoting talent

Study through the medium of toys and gadgets intensifies the socio-emotional learning and leads to the development of critical thinking of all age groups. The use of cognitive theme-based games and toys open up the potential exploration for the students.

Quality education encompasses the all-round development of an individual. Sai Bal Sansar truly believes that in a world where the boundaries are shrinking rapidly due to the rapid advancement in technology, children need to be equipped with an analytical mind, broad out-look, and a healthy body, hence, we aim to help every individual child achieve his or her true potential. Art and craft activities boost creativity and innovation, develop motor skills, and enhance concentration level in children. While books provide knowledge, hobbies instill qualities in children that are beneficial for their growth and over all development.

Children are engaged in different co-curricular activities, hobbies, sports activities to booster five Cs-competence, connections, confidence, character, and caring attitude among them. The school focuses on five essential Es-engage, explore, explain, elaborate, and evaluate.

Success in school exams does not prepare the students being successful in life. There is a need to re-imagine the purpose of education. Education other than providing employment should also aim towards making the country and the world a better place to live in.

Online education came to the rescue when schools were shut after the break of the COVID 19 pandemic. The shift to digital from physical classes leads to many issues and one of them includes students losing out on writing down notes. Several students have lost the habit of using pen and paper. Lack of writing practice has resulted in poor knowledge of grammar, incorrect spelling, sentence structure and bad handwriting. The transition from offline to online and vice versa has confused the entire system. In the online mode of education students have become lethargic and their grasping power has come down. So, teachers themselves have to have much patience in bringing every student to classroom seriousness which is the most difficult task.

The teachers are working determinedly to bring back what is lost in the two years of COVID impact.

Success Stories-

Nazrana: She joined Sai Bal Sansar in the year 2013 at the age of five and now has been promoted to level seven. Her parents are illiterate. Father is working as a mason and Mother is a housemaid. She has five siblings. Her one elder sister got married and another elder sister is at home without undergoing any studies. One elder brother studied up to 2nd level and has taken up a job now. Younger sister and younger brother are studying in level 4 and BC special class respectively. Nazrana is very attentive in the class and always remains first in the class. Lockdown period was so tough for her family. She couldn't attend any online classes due to the non-availability of mobile phone. She started taking study materials from other teachers and somehow managed to attend all exams.



She wants to continue her studies further to secure a job in a bank and to look after her family. She also helps her siblings in their studies.

Nandini Singh: She is in level eight. She has three elder sisters and one elder brother who completed his studies at SBS. She is an average student but actively participated in school functions such as Independence Day, Republic Day, XMAS, Children's Day, Annual Day and so on. At lockdown period it was very difficult for her to join the online classes due to the non-availability of mobile phone. Now she continues her schooling in the offline mode. She is good in studies and after completing her education, she wishes to take up a secure job. She aspires to be a teacher.





SAI VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTRE

Vocational courses will address job lacunae in future. These students will consequently provide job opportunities to others too. Knowledge of students who do not excel in academics can be converted productively. The right skills and attributes will equip our children to survive and thrive in the future.

For this purpose, Sai Vocational Training Centre (SVTC) was started on 30 April 2010 that trains candidates in skills such as Tailoring, Bakery & Cooking Courses, Beauty-culture, Computer Course, Spoken English on a highly subsidized fee. The students in SVTC comprise of persons who are mostly school dropouts/ too impoverished to pursue higher studies. After completion of these courses, they get employed or start their own enterprise. SVTC is working to ensure the enhancement of multi-dimensional skills and competency of the students.

COMPUTER AND SPOKEN ENGLISH

English proficiency is the need of the hour. Over the past decade this language has become global, and we need to see it as one of our tongues. Spoken English course trains students to improve their pronunciation through tailor-made video and communication skills.

Besides, giving training in computer and spoken English the students are made to realize that the workplace is becoming dynamic by the day. It is important to keep up with its pace by reading career related articles identifying new trends in job search, learning new skills, building a better resume and preparing beforehand, just to stay ahead of the curve and will help them to get their dream job.

The mixed mode of learning in post pandemic world would be beneficial to the students and ensure quality in learning outcomes besides developing job related skills.

Future in computer skills are to add ethical hacking, robotics as these is more innovative and are marketable. Unique courses are always on our minds to increase sustainability and global welfare that help consider several new jobs towards development.

True purpose of vocational training education is to create the leaders of tomorrow with life skills that are employable and do not become obsolete, creative people, capable of critical thinking and hence, logical decision making, replace follower mindset with explorer one.

Success Stories

1. Integrated Computer & Spoken English

Ms. Priya Kanojia, D/o. Late Kailash Kanojia living in Morna village, Sector-35, NOIDA along with her mother who is the only source of income to the family and her younger brother who is

studying in 10th standard. After her father expired in a road accident, her mother is making the living by way of a small set up of ironing the clothes in one of the societies in Sector-34, NOIDA.

Ms. Priya completed her Higher Secondary from the Government Inter College for girls at Hoshiarpur, Sector-51, NOIDA. Later she joined SVTC for the integrated course of Basic Computer and Spoken English. After successful completion of her course, she got placed as Office Executive in the Mahayana Urban Co-operative & Thrift Society Ltd. at A-7, Sector-10, NOIDA with a salary of Rs.12,000/- per month. Subsequently she has taken admission in IGNOU for her graduation. Now she is able to support her family financially at the same time pursuing her higher studies.

2. Tailoring

Ms. Komal Sharma D/o Mr. Shiv Sharma a student of B.A. lives in Chaura Village, Sector-22, Noida with her parents. She has two siblings studying in the school. Her mother is a home maker and the only earning member, father is a street vendor with a stall selling Gutka, candy etc. in the Khoda village.

During her second year of Degree Course in the Open University she joined the six months basic and advanced course of Tailoring and completed successfully. She has attended all the workshops for communication skills

conducted during the course duration which is mostly essential for a successful businessperson that will be lucrative and even for an employee. She has been placed as a teacher. Besides, she earns additionally by stitching clothes at home and selling them outside. As such she has become a prime supporter to her family financially.



3. Beauty Culture

Ms. Reshma, D/o. Mohammad Azar is living in Sector-9, JJ Colony, NOIDA. After passing 10th standard from Government School, she joined SVTC for the 6 months course of Basic Beauty Culture. While pursuing her studies in the school she used to work as a part time maid in her free time assisting her mother since her father does not support her family financially. After the successful completion of her vocational course, she got placed in Pragya Beauty Parlour on a salary of Rs. 5,000/- p.m. and is now supporting her family.



Bakery Course

Mr. Suresh Kumar is living in Sector-15, NOIDA with his wife and daughter. After passing 12th he worked as a courier boy for some time then he joined our bakery course on 14.09.2021. After completion of the course from SVTC, he is working in CREAM & CRUNCH, Sector-15, NOIDA at a salary of 13,000/- per month.



All these success stories are a proof how the project SVTC helps the youth from the marginalized society to thrive and lead a successful life.

VOLUNTEERS

Road Ahead and challenges:

- a) Great deal of efforts has been put in during the reporting period for acquiring the land for school by visiting the places where the availability of land came to be known. But most of these efforts were unsuccessful due to various reasons like unsuitability of the location, area/size of land, exorbitant cost etc. Despite these, the efforts are still going on hoping for the support from the well-wishers for this cause.
- b) There is a lull on the efforts for establishing a Day Care Centre for the rehabilitation of rag pickers due to the prevailing unfavourable conditions and unavailability of space to conduct the activities.






